



### **Balanced Scorecards**

- A management tool for tracking performance
- Translates statements of governance and vision to actionable strategies and commitments leading to the realization of breakthrough results
- Balanced Scorecard method applied to selected national agencies and local governments

### **Balanced Scorecards**

- The Performance Governance System (PGS) is the Philippine adaptation of the Balanced Scorecard model.
  - Allows governments agencies to be assessed objectively
  - Fosters transparency and accountability
  - Controls corruption through the participation of multi-sectoral stakeholders through the Multi-Sectoral Governance Coalition



### **Balanced Scorecards**

Public Governance Forum to showcase good

governance reforms implemented by national government agencies and local government units



 Forum conducted 2X a year to create trend for Islands of Good Governance by 2015 when the Philippines hosts APEC



### **Example:**

### **Department of Public Works and Highways**



Secretary Singson reported on the paving and upgrading of national roads, construction of permanent bridges, implementation of major flood control projects on major river basins, and other significant gains in its good governance and anti-corruption reforms under the "Daang Matuwid" policy agenda of the Aquino Administration.

### **Department of Public Works and Highways**



- Received the highest Performance Report Rating among all Millennium Challenge Corporation partner-agencies which presented during the recently held Public Governance Forum
- According to Institute of Solidarity in Asia, the DPWH has demonstrated continued determination to institutionalize good governance and deliver breakthrough results.

### **Regional Competitiveness**

#### Each committee -

- Tracks local competitiveness indicators
- Formulates programs to improve competitiveness
- Engages in investment promotion activities to attract investors and create new jobs



 Convened all committees in several dialogues in 2012 to construct a framework for local economic development and competitiveness









 Identified a set of indicators for the framework and validated the indicators at the city and municipality levels with the support of USAID-INVEST

  - Assess business environment
  - Design reforms
  - Map out how to make cities and municipalities more competitive vis-à-vis ASEAN cities

 Moving in the right direction but still have much work ahead of us

Public-Private Collaboration works

 Biggest challenges – Institutionalization and the permanence / irreversibility of reform

#### **Lessons Learned**

- 1. Transparency leads to Competitiveness: Governance matters.
- 2. Work-in-Progress is no longer good enough.
- 3. Importance of Execution and Delivery
- 4. Teamwork is required: No More Silos.
- 5. We must focus on Multiple Fronts (no single variable).
- 6. The Competition never sleeps.
- 7. The bar always rises. We move up a weight class and meet larger, stronger competition.
- 8. Speed-to-Reform should be our new mantra.
- 9. Maintaining Momentum is important (gain speed).
- 10. Embedding and institutionalizing change / reform for the long run is important. This has become a key concern.

#### FILIPINO CULTURE OF EXCELLENCE

- Individual and national sense of discipline (Filipino Time, do more with less mentality)
- Positive attitude and constant innovativeness (Kaya natin)
- Treating crisis as opportunities and oneself as part of the solution and never part of the problem (competitive spirit)
- Quality as a daily lifestyle (Di pwede ang pwede na)
- Strong Sense of Patronage (Buy Filipino goods/services)
- Strong partnership and networking with stakeholders through program ownership, get involved (reforms/policy issues)
